At the Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Southern Illinois (EFGSI), our mission is to passionately support each person in living a meaningful and satisfying life!

Through EFGSI, individuals with developmental disabilities are provided support to live as independently as possible within the community. EFGSI manages three Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA) homes within the Belleville, Illinois area. The individuals who reside at the CILAs are provided daily supports from a team of dedicated Direct Support Professionals.

The QIDP's primary purpose is to ensure that the individuals for whom you support are provided Person Centered Planning and Care including providing the individualized services needed to empower them to make choices of services desired, to enhance community inclusion while encourage individuals to live as they choose with integrity, dignity and quality of life.

This is a full-time position. Normal working hours are Monday through Friday 8:30 am – 4:30 pm. However, flexibility is required.
